ABTA Returns to Cal Bowl for Frozen Event this weekend

3-6-9 is \$1,800 at Cal Bowl

Welcome everyone to the weekly edition of ABTA news. In this weeks edition you will read about our return to Classic Lanes this past weekend where a turnout of 289 entries in our one day event, that featured the second of the two week handicap special. We had decent shot for the tournament making the cut scores of +91 for the men and +62 for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (3 men and 1 female) were Art Lindsey(+86), Manny Loria(+81), and Angie Nillo(-3). Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 68 bowlers making it to the semi-finals this week.

For all qualifying squads, our top qualifier for the Men was a tie between Louis Bachus and Joshua Navarro with a +200, and for the women it was Annaliza Agoncillo with a +62. They will receive a free entry to any regular tournament. Each week our top seed overall draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$1,272. The top seed drew a 573. We had two bowlers that bowled this score during qualifying and they were Billy Chao and Mike Bousquet, they will each get \$636. At our next event we will estimate the Match Series at \$300. For the 3-6-9 qualifying, we had two bowlers missed on their last shot, so they will split the \$50 consolation and they were Mark Fisser and Elvin Godoy. The 3/6/9 will be \$1,800 at Cal Bowl.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Joshua Navarro and Andrew Navarro with a 1557 for \$120. Finishing second was Charles Weeks and Adam McKenzie with 1509 for \$100. There was a total of \$1090 paid out in doubles and 18 paid spots with low to cash of 1424.

In the semis we saw three different leaders during the semis as the shot was different across all sections. During the first game it was Michael Kong and Andrew Lung taking the lead, but during the 2nd game it was Charles Weeks who jumped into the lead. But a big third game by Joevin Bolanos took over the lead with a 807 to take home the title in our Beat the board semi finals. He would finish in first for \$1,000, take home an additional \$850 in cash and carry for a total of \$1,850. Finishing in 2nd place was Charles Weeks with a 796 for \$500, and third place was Andrew Lung with a 795 for \$210, fourth place was Vuong Do with a 770 for \$135 and fifth place was Ryan Nam with a 748 for \$135.

Our top seed and winner would draw the match game worth \$3,500, the pot is maxed out and we have a back-up pot that is also maxed out, with a third pot now started, that will for sure put the Match Game at \$3,500 for our next two events. Our top seed drew a 254. After a review of all the scores bowled, one bowler, Kmel Cunanan had that score and he will take home \$3,500. We will have \$3,500 next week at Cal Bowl, and continue to build on the back-up pot, which is \$2,195. This week, we had six new bowlers joined us. Let us welcome these new bowlers to the club, Barbara Miller, Jay Miller, Russell Valentine, Aaron Hartnett, Todd Edwards Jr, and Jason Prelesnik.

Champion Jovein Bolanos is from Placentia and used a Storm Nano drilled by Ramon Torres. He is single and would like to thank Barry Asher and Mark Baker for the bowling clinic and Classic Lanes along with friends and family for their support.

Charles Weeks (2nd Place) is from Long Beach and used the 2 Furious by Storm that he drilled himself. He is single, but had his girlfriend, Lanae Kentner, there to support him. He would like to thank his parents, his girlfriend, Billy Myers Jr, the gang at Pro Approach, and Mark Baker for his help.

The weekly ball sponsor winner of a 900 Global Ball was Fred Ringor, and he won the Double Clutch. Each time you bowl, you get a free ticket for this prize given away by our Sponsor, 900 Global.
